Mr. Whiteman -- "The Moustache" Thought Questions

<u>Directions</u>: Answer each question in complete sentences... Assignment can be typed or neatly hand-written. Follow these steps to create the correct sentence structure:

- A. Begin by restating the question in your response
- B. Create a clear stance in your answer/response
- C. You must provide textual evidence to support your stance. Remember, this is where I want you to show me genuine thought! *** We will do #1 together in class... Paragraph structure = take a stance; provide textual evidence to support your stance, and discuss your thoughts. Vocabulary and Skill words are emboldened.
- 1. As we have discussed, our society tends to have the belief that a person loses his/her value as they age. The way people view and treat elderly people is often very **demeaning**. Identify and discuss at least two examples in which Mike's grandmother is treated in a demeaning way. *** We will do this one together in class and it will serve as an example to follow).
- 2. What **inference** can you make about the fact that when Mike returns from the nursing home he does not tell his mother about what happened there? Explain his decision...
- 3. Mike directly reveals a lot about himself in this story, but he doesn't tell us why he shaves off his moustache. What did you **infer** about his reasons for the shave? (be sure to explain the symbolism and possible themes of the "shave")...
- 4. Discuss at least two examples of **symbolism**. Be sure to clearly explain what each symbol represents and the role each play in the story. (use your notes on symbolism)
- 5. Does Mike do the right thing by saying "I forgive you, Meg"? What would you do if you were Mike? Fully explain and show me genuine thought!
